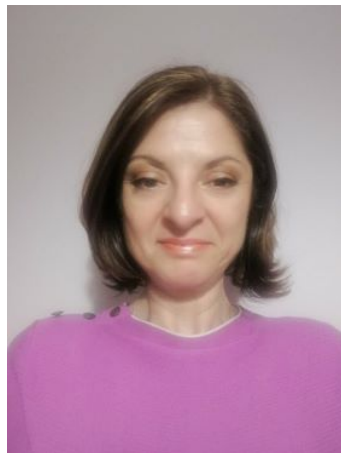

3.1. Communication/presentation skills

Excellent communication/presentation skills gained as Tourism consultant and expert in addition and as a result of my time as academic in higher education (through the processes of research, research results presentation in public, training and teaching) both oral/public and in writing:

2. to design, develop and assist to implement plans or strategies of tourism destination development on demand for local authorities, or to advise organizations such as museums or historical sites to produce their own interpretation for public/visitors.
3. to analyse and construct key messages as part of a promotional step/action particularly focussed identity, local – regional tourist branding, destination identity, local destination development.³
4. to develop, use and implement ‘story telling techniques and elements of performing arts as instruments of tourist site usage’⁴.

Mission and vision

Our mission is to create civic duty, promote inclusion and equality and teach volunteers new skills through non-formal education.

Universitur is an association whose main role is to help students and those wishing to get involved build new relations and be part of projects aimed at helping the community in (almost) any way possible. We aim at fostering youth participation and raising awareness about key issues young people face in today's world.

Our activity so far

Since the beginnings, Universitur developed several youth projects with a strong social impact on the community life. We collaborated with several associations (on national and international level), sharing and creating new tool kits for social inclusion and awareness. We've organized two Youth in Action projects and one Grundtvig workshop, two of which have received best practice recognition from our National Agency. We have organised a youth exchange on labyrinth theatre and intercultural conflict resulted from migration (Labyrinth of Conflicts), a training course on storytelling and social inclusion (ROOTS - Rediscovering Our Origins Through Storytelling) and a Grundtvig workshop (Image-in the Community) on photovoice, all of

them successfully using innovative and interactive methodologies that had a multiplication effect in certain partner countries. We've also been partners and sending organization in many other Youth in Action and ERASMUS+ projects, tackling issues such as marginalization and discrimination against minorities and vulnerable groups, the impact of migration and intergenerational issues.

In the academic world, Universitur partnered with the University of Bucharest and other national and international partners to participate in and organise conferences on the topic of sustainability and tourism.

By working closely with young students from different European countries, the association managed to build a diverse cultural environment and a supportive, unbiased space for personal development and self-expression.

Universitur's activity

A. Current projects

1. Labyrintour

It is the most complex project developed by Universitur in partnership with Zepelin Tour Travel Agency. It aims to develop the professional and vocational skills of the students of the Faculty of Geography, University of Bucharest.

Through this project, students are being offered valuable expertise regarding the creation of tourist products (mainly tours) and their promotion. They also have the opportunity to take part in the actual tourist activity as travel guides or trainers during the team-building sessions. The project aims to promote remote areas and resources which have not been exploited by the stakeholders in the industry, both in Bucharest and throughout the country. New interpretation techniques are being used, such as storytelling and participatory theatre.

2. Workshops for/with students (2010 - present)

Universitur organises monthly workshops on:

- How to write grant proposals for European projects;
- Project management and organisation management;
- Tourist products creation;
- The importance of non-formal education for personal development;

3. Zepelin Tour Internship (2012-present)

This project is dedicated mainly to the students of Geography of Tourism. It is developed in partnership with Zepelin Tour Travel Agency and it offers the opportunity for 2 students/ month to actively take part in the daily activities of the company, raising their chances for employment.

B. Recurrent projects

1. *Labyrinth theatre performances*

Labyrinth theatre is a form of participatory theatre. Unlike the classical theatre plays in which the participants form a passive audience, labyrinth theatre is tailored for each individual, involving him actively. Going through a labyrinth is, on one hand, an alternative cognitive process - allowing the individual to learn by experiencing a certain topic, and on the other hand a self-awareness process based on a different kind of perception. During the labyrinth, the "spect-actor" deals with a space and a time of uncertainty, getting involved with all their senses and being encouraged to reconnect to their inner self.

2. *P.E.T. Rafting Project I* (1 August -12 August 2011)

The main aim of the project was to increase the environmental awareness on the degrading ecosystem of the Danube Delta and surrounding areas. Five young volunteers built a raft entirely from recycled plastic bottles, and launched it in the Danube waters. They navigated between the village of Stelnica and Saint George (aka Sfântul Gheorghe).

3. *P.E.T. Rafting Project II* (12 August - 25 August 2012)

During this project, a team of six young volunteers from the cities of Ialomița, Bacău, and Călărași, built a raft made entirely out of recycled plastic bottles (1,500 used plastic bottles). They have successfully navigated between Călărași and Gura Portiței for 450 km. Stop-overs included: Dichiseni, Stelnica, Făcăeni, Măgureni, Brăila, Galați, Isaccea, Pătlăgeanca, Tulcea, Mahmudia, Murighiol, Gura Portiței.

At the end of the project, part of the recycled bottles were taken to a recycling point and the rest have been donated to a villager from Jurilovca with the intention of reusing the plastic material in an eco-friendly way.

Due to the impact and the importance of the project on the community and ecosystem, Iulian Nichita, (member of Universitatur Association), presented the project at the TEDxReghin Talks conference (<https://www.facebook.com/tedxreghin>)
