



Any proposed candidates must have the written endorsement of the Patriarchate. In this regard, kindly note that applications must first be submitted to the Embassy for preliminary consideration, prior to any further evaluation process.

Candidates who may be selected will be required to submit the following documentation (Originals, duly translated into Greek and officially certified, will be requested only upon selection, and must subsequently be submitted to the respective academic institutions within 1 month):

Undergraduate Studies – Required Documents:

1. Secondary school leaving certificate (or equivalent) with detailed transcript
2. Certificate from the competent educational authority confirming that the qualification grants access to higher education
3. Certificate of nationality of the candidate and his/her parents
4. Criminal record certificate
5. Medical certificate
6. Copy of valid passport
7. Certificate issued by the Patriarchate

Postgraduate Studies – Additional Requirements:

*(In addition to items 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 above)*

8. Letter of acceptance from a supervising professor in Greece, prior to arrival
9. Certified copy of undergraduate degree with recognition and full academic transcript

Doctoral Studies – Additional Requirements:

*(In addition to all the above, including items 8 and 9)*

10. Certified copy of a recognized Master's degree with official recognition

Candidates will also be required to attend an interview at the Embassy of Greece in Bucharest. Furthermore, candidates who do not possess a certified B2 level of Greek language proficiency will be required to attend a one-year preparatory Greek language course at the Language Centers of the Universities of Athens or Thessaloniki. Upon completion, they must successfully pass the relevant examination in order to obtain the required B2 certification for enrolment.

It should also be noted that the selected scholarship holders will be entitled to the following benefits:

1. Free Greek language instruction for one academic year
2. Admission, without entrance examinations, to undergraduate programmes
3. Tuition-free enrolment in postgraduate programmes
4. Tuition-free enrolment in doctoral programmes
5. Meals provided at a student dining facility, under certain conditions (not applicable during the preparatory Greek language year)
6. Residence permit for the full duration of their studies
7. Monthly allowance of €650

It is further noted that scholarship holders are not provided with free medical, pharmaceutical, or hospital care. They are therefore required to obtain private health insurance for the entire duration of their stay in Greece.
